





The Marco Gonzalez Maya Site



Tucked deep inside the mangrove forests of Ambergris Caye is the Marco Gonzalez Archaeological site.

The Marco Gonzalez Maya Site is located near the southern tip of Ambergris Caye. It was first recorded

archaeologically in 1984 by Dr. Elizabeth Graham and Dr. David M. Pendergast, who named it after their local guide. However, the existence of the site had been known to San Pedranos for many years before that, as had most of the many other sites that are present on the caye.

The site is approximately eight kilometers south of San Pedro Town, and is surrounded by dense jungle. Access to the site from the windward beach side was relatively easy, along cut trails, while the site was being excavated by Drs. Graham and Pendergast from 1984 to about 1994. Now, however, the trails are overgrown and visits to the site are difficult, especially during and immediately after the rainy seasons.

The Marco Gonzalez Site is about 185 x 355 meters in size, and it is readily visible from the air immediately before landing in San Pedro from Belize International Airport. The low-lying area around the site is close to sea level, and it is a "mangal" jungle-swamp of red mangroves (Rhizophora mangle) and black mangroves (Avicennia nitida). Surface deposits of this swamp are mainly mangrove "peat" (the predecessor of coal) that over lie carbonate sands and muds. Two small areas of Pleistocene limestone, the "bedrock" of Ambergris Caye, are exposed along the shore to the north of the site. The site is topographically higher than the surrounding swamps, its maximum elevation being about 3.6 meters above sea level. It is covered by white mangrove (Laguncularia racemosa), gumbo-limbo (Bursera simaruba), white poisonwood ("chechem", Cameraria belizensis), silver palmettos (*Thrinax* sp.), cabbage palms (Roystonea oleracea), and a variety of vines, sedges, and grasses.

The site is higher than the surrounding mosquito-infested swamps because of human activities, specifically, buildup of the area resulting from millenia of accumulated, typically dark colored "anthrosol," which is soil composed primarily of artifacts (e.g., pottery, tools), conch and other shells, building remains, processing debris, and other wastes from human activities. Common lore has it that the Maya brought in the dark soil that surrounds all sites on the caye, but that is erroneous; all such "anthrosol" is a natural product of long-lived habitation at each site. The presence of artifacts below the present-day surface, particularly beneath the mangal swamps, indicates that the site was once larger than is presently exposed.

There are at least 49 structures and walls within the exposed, presently mapped area of the site. The structures at the north end appear to be arranged






into small plaza groupings, whereas elsewhere the building plan appears to be less formal. All of the structures at the site are relatively low platforms, actually

building foundations rather than pyramids, that range in height from 30 centimeters to 4.2 meters. Pyramids such as are present at Altun Ha, Cerros, and Lamanai are not present at the Marco Gonzalez Site. Building foundations are composed mainly of blocks of Pleistocene limestone that probably was quarried from on or closely around Ambergris Caye. Accessory building materials in-

clude the queen conch Strombus gigas and other shells. All of these materials were probably brought to the site by canoe, and/ or were hand-carried. The site is littered by enormous amounts of broken pottery as well as conch shells (one of the primary food sources of the Maya), chert tools, and locally, human bones (burials). The site had been extensively looted in the past, so there are many looting pits throughout the area. Crude plaster floors were found in some structures, and evidence suggests that many of the habitations were pole and thatch-roof **Continued on Page 7**









Excavations by Graham and Pendergast (1989) indicate that initial occupation of the site occurred about 2100 years ago, during the Late Preclassic. Based on our sea level history curve for northern offshore Belize, sea level was about 0.6 meters lower then than at present, and sea level subsequently rose to its present elevation as the last of the Pleistocene glaciers around the world melted. The site appears to have been continuously occupied from then to about 500 years ago as sea level slowly rose, at which time it was abruptly abandoned. The Maya "made their living" at Marco Gonzalez by exploiting marine food resources and, during the Late Classic Period (from about 1200-1500 years ago), by intensive salt processing. Salt was collected by evaporating sea water in pans. The peak period of occupation at the site was during the Postclassic Period, from about 800-600 years ago. Evidence suggests that the Maya at Marco Gonzalez traded extensively with other Maya sites during this period. The abundant pottery that litters the site is relatively crude, and was made from mixtures of clay and quartz sand (used as temper). Insofar as there is no available source of clay or quartz sand on Ambergris Caye, most of the pottery must have been brought to the site from








elsewhere (alternatively, the sand and clay could have been brought to the site, and the pottery made there, although this interpretation appears less likely to the author). Other artifacts at the site clearly were also brought in from elsewhere because they have no natural source anywhere on Ambergris Caye, such as the many chert and flint tools (silicon dioxide) and other granite artifacts, minor jade, and obsidian that are present. The community's setting on the tip of Ambergris Caye may have given its inhabit-



ants a strategic position in the maritime trade routes that existed at the time.

weeks, or months, to reach the high proficiency.

The first lesson begins on the beach. Using a scale model, Chris explains how the wind pulls the kite and the impact on the surfer. Then, he explains the equipment which involves lots of strings, rigging, a harness and kites of every shape and size.

Before long, you are on a boat, headed out towards the shallow waters near the reef. Once you are about a quarter mile from shore and near the crashing waves of the reef, student and instructor jump into the shallow water to put what you have learned so far into practice. The main reason the lessons are conducted away from the beach is the shear size of the kites and keeping them from interfering with others on the beach and water traffic near the piers.

In the water, Chris again describes how to control the enormous kite. Four lines are attached to a pole, which is connected to a harness around your waste. This takes the pressure off your arms, so although it appears this sport takes tremendous upper body strength,

it doesn't. "Even the girls at The San Pedro Sun can do it," this student jokes.

The goal of this first lesson is to learn the mechanics of flying the kite. Reading the wind, you discover where the most "power" comes as the kite is caught by the wind. Rapidly making the kite dive and rise gives the kite its power and by the end of lesson one, you are bodysurfing across the water to shore.




"No wonder he was smiling," Don said. "I would die smiling, too."




