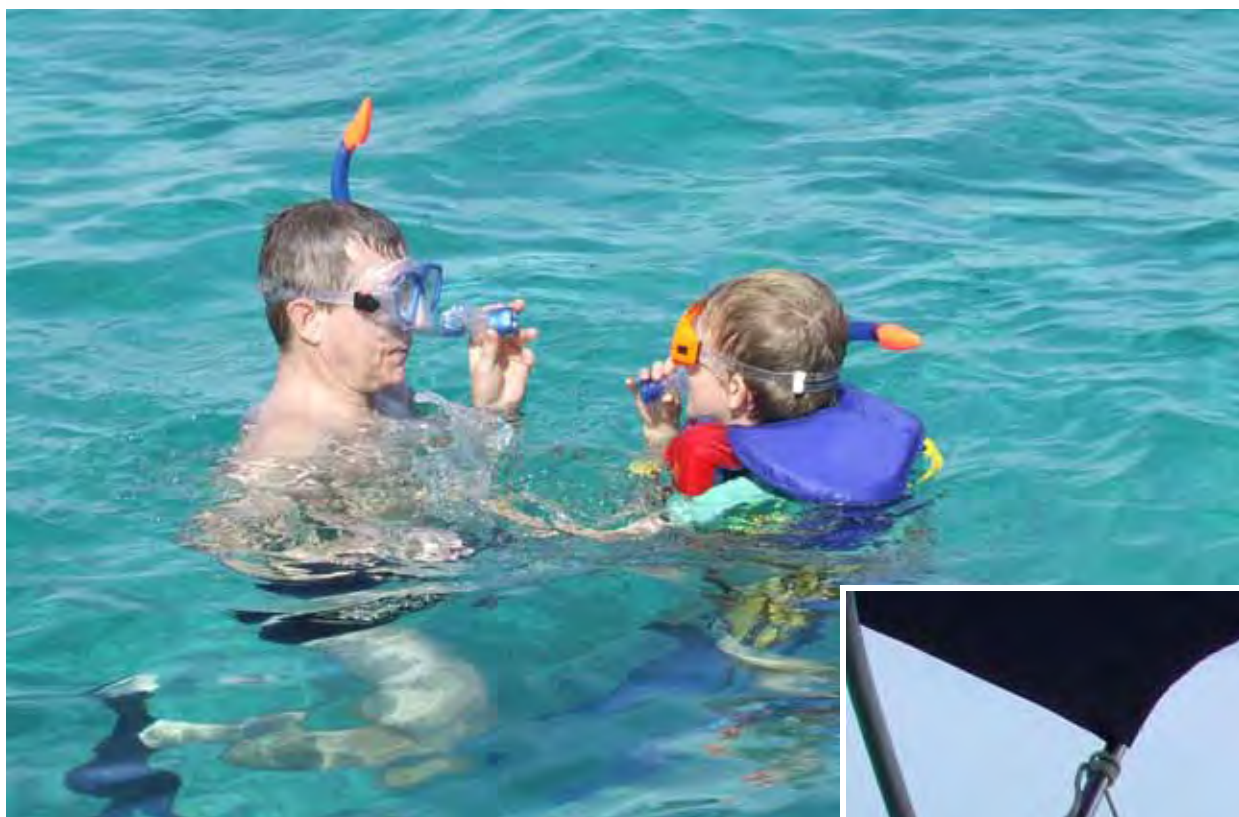

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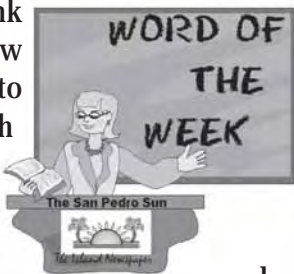

Snorkeling Adventures on the reef

Perhaps one of the easiest and certainly diverse, family-friendly adventures one can experience while visiting Ambergris Caye is snorkeling. There are many qualified tour businesses and guides available at reasonable expense for half-day and full day trips. Most hotel concierges can arrange the day for you or many tour businesses are situated on the beach and in town where you can arrange the trip yourself. Most of them can provide you with snorkel gear if needed and can pick you up at a dock nearest to where you are staying. That said, it is a pretty painless way to arrange a fun day in the water exploring the incredible creatures and corals that make up the Great

Mesoamerican Reef.

Snorkeling is a simple technique that requires little practice. For the novice it is always a good idea to try on your equipment before leaving the dock and your guide should be able to help you determine if your equipment is a good fit. The real beauty in snorkeling is that anyone who can swim (or reasonably float) can snorkel regardless of age and ability. This means that families with kids in tow, along with Grandma and Grandpa, can all experience the adventure together. What an incredible way to make lifelong memories that you can all share forever. For families with youngsters this is an opportunity to teach them about the wonders of the

sea while instilling a sense of confidence in experiencing the environment while swimming.

For first time snorkelers, regardless of age but especially with children, there may be some apprehension. The timeless saying "we fear what we do not know" could not be more appropriate. **Continued on Page 4**

Barton Creek Cave Canoeing – An ancient Maya burial site, the cave is only accessible by canoe. The formations of stalactites and stalagmites are beautiful!

Jaguar Paw Cave Tubing – Hike along the Cave Branch River to the Jaguar Paw cave systems where you then float the gentle currents through underground caverns.

Xunantunich – Beautiful Maya ruins where standing atop "El Castillo", the largest pyramid at the site, you will have a panoramic view of western Belize and eastern Guatemala.

Belize Zoo – The zoo is home to over 100 species of native Belizean animals and birds including the tapir, howler monkeys, spider monkeys, jaguars, ocelots, margays, scarlet macaws, toucans, and many, many, others.

Actun Tunichil Muknal Cave – A challenging adventure for the physically fit and the ability to swim is a plus. Inside the cave you will see burial chambers with intact calcified remains and Mayan artifacts.

Jungle River Tubing and Horseback Riding – Tube down the Caves Branch River and horseback ride back to where the tubing originated.

The San Pedro Sun's Virtual Taste Trip Breakfast Burritos

"Breakfast is the most important meal of the day. A different way to start your day. Burritos with fried eggs, bacon and refried beans topped with melted cheese. Ham or sausage may be substituted for the bacon. Serve with salsa on the side."



Ingredients:

- *1 pound bacon
- *10 eggs
- *1 (16 ounce) can refried beans
- *8 ounces shredded Cheddar cheese
- *10 (10 inch) flour tortillas

Directions:

*Place bacon in a large, deep skillet. Cook over medium high heat until evenly brown. Drain, and set aside. Wrap the tortillas in foil and warm in the oven.

*Fry the eggs in a greased skillet until firm. In a small sauce pan heat the refried beans.

*Top each tortilla with refried beans, two strips of bacon, one egg and a little cheese. Roll tortillas into burritos and serve.

The boat ride takes about 20 minutes and our guides, Jeffery and Ali are friendly and accommodating. Jeffery, who is the captain, introduces himself and Ali and explains to us the plan for the day. Joining us onboard are a family with a teenage son and daughter and another family with two young boys age's ten and eight, a perfect combination of age groups and abilities. Once we arrive at Mexico Rocks Jeffery and Ali determine that Jeffery will lead the family with the young boys and Ali will guide the remaining group. Both guides tow a life

Our pick was definitely the Tackle Box Burger, and since we wanted a nice, 'light' lunch, we opted for the Quartered instead of the Original ½ pounder. (Brave souls can try the 'Rock da Box' Burger – a hefty one-pounder WITH a side of fries!) Accompanied by a side of delicious spicy Box fries, this burger was absolutely scrumptious. Another lunch choice was their Wings. Our very friendly waiter Ricky gave us both options: Mild or Hot? Being a bit wimpy, we chose the mild. Thank goodness we did! The heat on the mild wings was still cause for a bit of sniffing on our part. It's not directly hot, but slowly, with each wing, the heat builds. It burns so good!

Also on the menu are Blue Plate Specials, Chap's daily specials that offer a bit of something different – some comfort food amidst all the exotic seafood and nouvelle cuisine available on our island. Mondays are Tackle Mama's Meatloaf; Tuesdays are Mimi's Southern-Style Chicken & Dumplings; Wednesdays are Chap's Famous Chicken Fried Steak, while Fridays are Box's Barbeque Beef Brisket. ring along in case someone decides to take a break from swimming.

It is clear the young boys are excited about their pending adventure and are eager to get into the water.

Once in the water one boy exclaims in excitement, "Look Dad, it's a Fairy basslet!" What an incredible experience for these young children, and knowing what they are looking at

makes it all the more exciting for them. It is like a game of "hide and seek" spotting the colorful fish as they dart in and out coral crevices and it is a sure delight for children of all ages!

Every snorkel trip seems to have its "highlights" and today's is no exception. With the trained eye of our guide Ali, he dives under a lobster shade and retrieves an Arrow Crab. The delicate, long legged creature is weightless to hold and a tries in vain to deliver little pinches to our hands. After we all admire the creature Ali returns it to its home and we continue our swimming trek. Mexico Rocks is about eight to ten feet deep with huge outcrops of brain coral that create a sense of canyons and paths one can explore. The water is teeming with fish and we spot the mainstay of damsel fish, squirrel fish, snappers and grunts that call the area home. Purple sea fan coral sway in the gentle cur-

rent and we find small colorful Flamingo Tongue snails crawling along the branches, digesting the coral animals as it grazes. The real treat is identifying the electric blue, green and gold Queen angelfish and the black and gold French angelfish with white puckered lips. The male Spotlight parrotfish are an iridescent kaleidoscope of rainbow colors while the female is modeled with red and white scales, you would never think the two were related! After we spend almost an hour discovering the underwater wonder world we all board the boat and excitedly share our experience with each other. While drinking fresh water and juice Jeffery points out a Spotted eagle ray that gracefully glides past our boat, displaying its beautiful black body with leopard-like white spots, a real treat to see! As we continue to visit and quench our thirst we

pass around fish ID cards trying to identify the huge variety of fish we saw. After re-grouping we pull up anchor and set off to our second snorkel spot, Tres Coco's.

The beauty of snorkeling off Ambergris Caye is that each site is unique and offers a new experience with each dive. At Tres Coco's we snorkel close to the reef where the waves break nearby and the water is shallow, three

to four feet deep and crystal clear. Unlike Mexico Rocks, the area is dense with Elkhorn coral which appears wind swept and ship wrecked, with the forest-like growths offering the fish habitat heaven. With the clarity and the abundant coral you truly feel like you are swimming in an aquarium. White and black Banded butterflyfish travel in pairs, taking turns in who follows the lead, and the

white, yellow and black Foureye butterflyfish, with their distinct black "eye" located at their tail also travel as a couple, darting in and out of the coral in search of food. For those who prefer a more shallow dive this is the perfect place! Again Jeffery leads the family with the young boys while the rest of us are free to explore on our own.

After an awesome time at Tres Coco's we board the boat and settle into our short ride back, stopping to drop off the families at their hotels. Along the way we are treated to more refreshments and incredible fresh

baked coconut tarts, just the perfect sweet and crisp taste sensation we are looking for after ingesting our share of salty sea water! Yum! All of this in just a few hours...simply amazing! It is a perfect half-day for the kids who may be in need of a nap at this point, and even the grown-ups are thinking some quality time in a nearby hammock sounds pretty darn good! Exploring what's under the sea is a must when you visit San Pedro and snorkeling is a perfect way to do so, we encourage you to enjoy the wonders of the reef and the creatures that call it home.

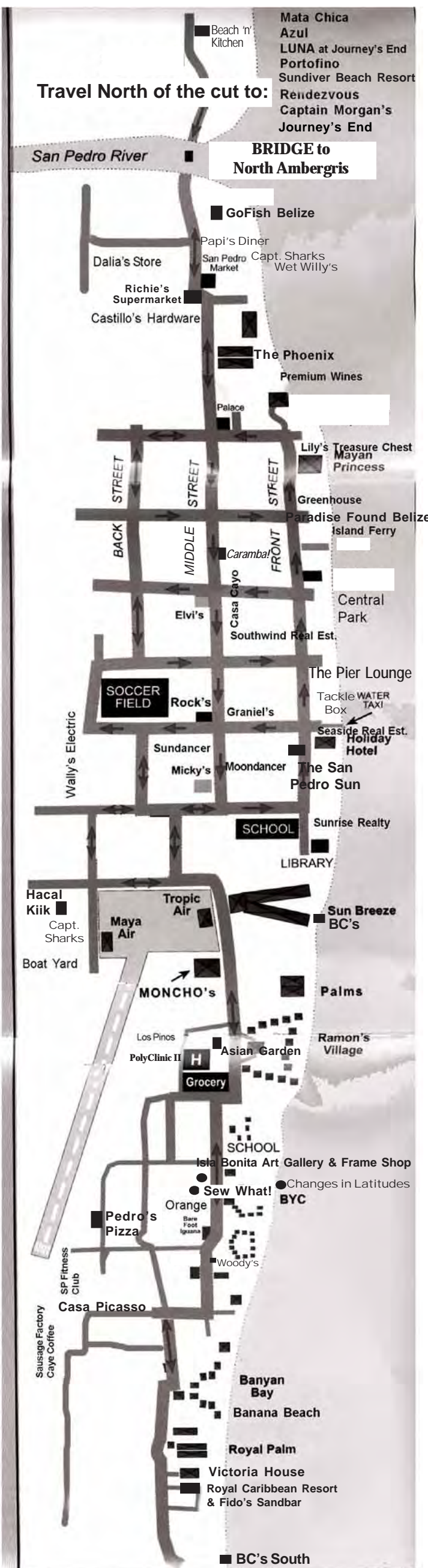
