

# Scuba 101 - Part II



Elbert demonstrates one form of entry for our first lesson at sea.

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The first chapter dealt with getting used to the underwater world ... a world that is so much more different than the one we are used to. "Above water, you see, hear and move about in a familiar and comfortable manner that seems 'normal' because you're used to it. But underwater, you're in a new world where seeing, hearing, and staying warm differ from in air."

Because light travels at different speeds in both the water and in the air, there are many optical effects that need to be taken into consideration when going diving. One of the effects is that underwater everything seems closer

than what they really are. Same as looking through the rearview mirror of a car. Color varies as well depending on how deep of a dive you take. "As white light travels through water, the water absorbs colors one by one; first red, followed by orange and yellow, with green and blue last. [...] To see more vivid colors on deeper dives, you may want to take an underwater light, which provides unfiltered light and reveals color." Sound is another effect that needs to be taken into consideration; sound travels farther in water than in air, so you'll be able to hear

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

things at distances that you can't in air. It also travels at faster rates and because of this it is hard to tell where a sound is coming from directly. To attract your dive buddy or master, the easiest way to do it is to "rap on your tank with your dive knife or something else solid.'

Diving is a relaxing sport; one that hardly allows you to get overexerted. However, if for some reason you do get overexerted, it is imperative that you stop immediately and breathe.

Symptoms of overexertion include labored breathing, anxiety, and a feeling of suffocation. This can be avoided by knowing your physical limits and pacing yourself in order to avoid breathlessness.

"Left unchecked, body heat loss can lead to hypothermia, a serious condition in which your body cools so much it can't function normally." Yes, temperatures vary when underwater and any diver can tell you that the sport is

not enjoyed as much once one gets cold. In order to avoid this wearing a wet suit is recommended. "When you begin to shiver continuously, get out of the water immediately, dry off and seek warmth immediately."

As well, exploring the fragile environment around sensitive marine life with dive equipment requires one to be extra careful so as not to harm the ecosystem. This can be prevented by:

- (1) Swimming next to the reef rather than above it. This avoids damage from your fin kicks.
- (2) By watching your buoyancy and not diving over-weighted. Stay neutral to avoid the tendency to drag along the reef where your legs and feet can destroy things.
- (3) Turn sideways when you look under ledges. Your tank adds some height, and it's not always easy to estimate how much. If you turn sideways, you reduce the likelihood of bashing your tank against the reef.
  - (4) If you need to swim over the **Continued on Page 8**



reef, swim well above it.

(5) Keep your hoses secured and don't let anything dangle.

Being able to communicate underwater is very important and chapter 2 deals with the most common and used hand signals. Signals may vary somewhat, so review them when planning a dive with a new buddy; especially because some hand signals may mean something to you and something completely different to some one else.

Chapter 2 also deals with the buddy system; where you are paired off with someone and you therefore provide "extra" eyes and hands for your buddy and vice versa.

Lastly, chapter 2 deals with entry and exit procedures as well as many of the "extra" equipment that you might take with you on your dive.

When you take your second shallow dive, your instructor is careful to make sure that you are comfortable prior to proceeding.

I had no idea what to expect from my first diving trip out of a confined space. With gear and equipment all in place, our instructor, Elbert Greer picked us up from Amigos del Mar dock en route to the beautiful Hol Chan Marine Reserve.

For our lunch that day, we were treated to Snapper Caribbean, the daily lunch special, and a platter of Italian Herb Chicken. A whole red



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

"newbies" appreciate the trip to its fullest. Although, my fear for open water was kicking in, I managed to get myself together and jump in with my trusty companion, Tony. He provided instruction at the rate I was comfortable with and made my dive or at least at the "surface" much better. All the equipment worked well and if any problems arose he would take care of it very promptly.

Underwater, we got to see countless species of marine creatures; from colorful yellow snappers, eagle rays, brain corals, the elusive puffer fish,

schools of other fish and an enormous black grouper. WOW, that thing was so overwhelming; he kept chasing us in the water! Other than that, the underwater world was amazing; the coral formations were magical; even from the surface.

I wasn't comfortable at the top, much less taking a 25 foot dive so I just spent the time roaming and swimming freely at the top with equipment and all. Diving is an extreme sport and it's not for everyone, but for thrill seekers, this is just the sport for you. I learned a wealth of information and would recommend this course to anyone interested in becoming involved in diving. I'm often the type to sit back and analyze things a bit, especially after they are through. Pondering back on the weekend beginner diving course I took with Elbert and companions, it was a good experience, one that I will need to work on if I want to get certified.

still feel slightly queasy. (Or maybe it was the hurried breakfast I had?)

Once we have anchored at Hol Chan, it's time to get ready. I take deep calming breaths as I strap on my BCD and mask. Following instructions from Elbert and Tony, I scoot over to the side of the boat and prepare for a nice backward landing. After observing Elbert's and Jem's perfectly executed fall into the water, I try to follow through and after taking a deep breath and dream of *Finding Nemo*, I land with a splash into the water.

The water is nice, but my first instinct is to PANIC! Somehow, in the pool, strapping on a lead belt and tank onto my back made sense, but now, I am in the ocean! Who does this stuff? I struggle to the surface, and come upon the friendly and helpful face of Elbert, my instructor. He's smiling, extending his hand. As soon as I grab on to his fingers with a vise-like grip, I calm

As soon as I feel myself floating upwards, I remember Elbert's instructions to swim like Wonder Woman (head down and body follows). Before I know it, Elbert is pointing to my gauge, and it hits me, I AM 20 FEET UNDER WATER!!! Two Spotted Eagle Rays are right in front of us, and immediately my fear is wiped away. They swim majestically over the coral, perfectly in sync, and to-

tally captivating. We swim all around the channel enjoying the wonderful sights, and while I don't find Nemo, I get to see Dori (Blue Tangs), and it's quite an adventure discovering this new world.

Being underwater is like no other feeling, and with the helpful hands of Elbert, I am able to enjoy the views that so many never get to experience. I can't wait to go back out there. This time I might let go of Elbert's hands, if only for a while!






